A. Call to Order/Roll Call/Welcome

Roll call was conducted, and ten voting members were present, a quorum was established.

B. ACTION: Consent Agenda – Receive and Approve

- 1. Minutes for Board Meeting of November 1, 2019
- 2. Board Meeting Attendance Report for 2018/2019
- 3. Financial Report through November 30, 2019

Ramiro Inguanzo moved approval of the consent agenda; Bob Harrison seconded the motion; the motion was approved unanimously.

C. APPROVAL: LGHN Regional Chapter Agreement

Bob Harrison provided background information from the board retreat in Florida when LGHN launched the chapter development as a way to grow membership. At the board retreat in Evanston, IL the board agreed to take the chapter concept to the next step of regional chapters. The membership committee created a template to guide discussions with potential reginal chapters. Current LGHN chapters participated in the discussions. There were concerns expressed about current chapters potentially forming as regional chapters due to potential financial benefits related to dues.

Samantha Tavares reported that the PHN chapter discussed their options and will keep the current single jurisdiction structure. Depending on the dues structure to be approved, the biggest impact on single jurisdiction chapters moving to a regional structure would be significant changes to their current board structure. The PHN board likes the proposed regional structure, especially for smaller communities and would serve as a liaison to assist them in forming a regional chapter.

Carlos Baia stated he likes the regional chapter model but would like to see more definition regarding what a regional chapter looks like. Karen Davis responded that this could be addressed on a case-by-case basis with potential regional chapters.

Claudia Lujan expressed concerns about expanding LGHN too quickly and the impact on LGHN finances; also, what happens if the chapters go rogue – how will LGHN build in precautions? How will LGHN provide for use of the LGHN logo and tax-exempt status? What protocols are in place to mitigate concerns? Ramiro Inguanzo provided an example for the Miami/Dade County area whi9ich includes 34

cities, and only a few are currently LGHN local government members. Creating a regional chapter would create an opportunity for local outreach to encourage more cities to engage and participate.

Rolando Fernandez stated he likes the idea of working with regions and is more concerned about how the model will work and what the chapters are called, i.e., all called "chapters" vs. "local government" and "regional" chapters. He stated that growing our membership is beneficial to the ability to get sponsorships. He also stated that chapters should be fully formed when they request approval to be an official LGHN chapter.

Rolando Fernandez moved that the membership committee move forward on creating regional chapters; Carlos Baia seconded the motion; the motion passed unanimously.

D. APPROVAL: 2020 LGHN Membership Dues Structure

The board reviewed the proposed membership dues structure for 2020, which included a new category of dues for regional chapters. Rolando Fernandez encouraged the board to have the same dues structure for all chapters regardless of whether they are a single jurisdiction or a regional chapter. Karen Davis explained that having the same membership categories would give a significant benefit to local governments in regional chapters over single jurisdiction chapters. I could also potentially have an impact on the LGHN budget, which gets a significant amount of revenue from job postings, which is an included benefit to local government members and chapters. Carlos Baia suggested the discussion be deferred to the January board meeting when there would be more time to have a broader discussion. The board concurred with deferring the discussion to January.

E. APPROVAL: 2020 LGHN Budget

Karen Davis provided an overview of the LGHN budget. Claudia Lujan moved approval of the budget; Ramiro Inguanzo seconded the motion; the motion passed unanimously.

F. DISCUSSION: Working with ICMA on Issues Related to Affiliate Agreement

Karen Davis reported that LGHN and NFBPA have an opportunity to provide a statement in support of the ICMA ballot on expanding membership. Pat Martel said she would get the details for how to proposed with submitting a statement.

Due to time constraints, further discussion was deferred to the January board meeting.

G. ICMA Executive Board Nominations for 2020

Karen Davis referred the board to the ICMA protocols provided in the packet. Nominations are due January 6, 2020.

Corporate

Individual Corporate Membership – Business leaders who have an interest in working with local governments. Membership \$250 per calendar year.

Large Business Membership – Businesses with more than 200 employees who have an interest in working with local governments. Each Large Business Member may designate up to ten (10) employees as Individual Corporate Members of IHN. Membership \$2,000 per calendar year.

Small Business Membership – Businesses with 200 or fewer employees who have an interest in working with local governments. Each Small Business Member may designate up to five (5) employees as Individual Corporate Members of IHN. Membership dues \$1,000 per calendar year.

Any additional member added to Large or Small Business Membership is \$100 per calendar year.



LGHN Dues Structure for Chapters

At the December board meeting, the board reviewed the proposed membership dues structure for 2020, which included a new category of dues for regional chapters. The issue was deferred to the January board meeting due to several issues arose that require additional discussion. Among these issues are:

- Whether to have the same dues structure for all chapters regardless of whether they are a single jurisdiction or a regional chapter?
- How to establish a dues structure that provides equ9ty to the different categories of membership.
- What are the impacts of the alternative dues structures to the LGHN budget?
- The concept of regional chapters is to attract jurisdictions who are not now or may not become engaged LGHN members. The dues structure that was recommended by the committee was intended to provide an incentive to local governments who are not currently members and may not otherwise join.

Some additional information for consideration in the discussion of dues structure:

- Advertising sales (job postings) currently provide \$20,000 to the LGHN budget from non-local government and non-chapter members. Postings are \$75 per 30-day posting. Local government and chapter members have this included as a benefit of membership. Small local government members pay \$750 per year and most jurisdictions post more than ten postings which essentially pays for their membership. The same is true of larger jurisdictions who pay \$1,500 for local government membership.
- Single jurisdiction chapters get the same benefit, although at higher dues, but they also get significantly more members included in their dues.

The membership committee recommends one of two structures for regional/multi-jurisdictional chapters. Two other options were discussed at the December board meeting:

- Option 1: \$500 per jurisdiction regardless of size.
 - This option would simplify the dues collection by the chapters, but it does provide a significant dues reduction for large organizations as well as unlimited members.
- Option 2: \$500 per small jurisdiction and \$1,000 per large jurisdiction.
 - This option would provide for a distinction for small and large jurisdictions while providing a discount compared to the local government jurisdictions' dues as an incentive to become members as well as unlimited members.
- Option 3: \$750 per small jurisdiction and \$1,500 per large jurisdiction.
 - This option would not provide discounted dues as an incentive and would maintain a revenue stream to LGHN consistent with what would be received if they became LGHN members. The added benefit would be an unlimited number of members.
- Option 4: Maintain the same dues structure for single jurisdiction and multi-jurisdiction/regional chapters.

This option would simplify and treat all chapters similarly. It does provide some inequities in what single jurisdictions would be paying for the benefits they receive. For example:

- 1. A single jurisdiction chapter with up to 50 members would pay \$1,500.
- 2. A multi-jurisdictional/regional chapter with up to 50 members would pay \$1,500 regardless of how many jurisdictions participate. Assume that a chapter has 5 jurisdictions participating in the chapter, each would pay \$300 with an average of 10 memberships per jurisdiction. In comparison, a small local government member would pay \$750 (7 memberships).

The board will need to discuss how to make dues equitable for all jurisdictions.

It is unknown what the impact might be to the LGHN budget, but as non-local government or chapter members, the jurisdiction would pay \$75 per job posting.

Note: The chapter would collect the dues from its members and LGHN would receive one payment.

Information from previous board discussion regarding working with ICMA on issues related to affiliate agreement:

- Ray Gonzales suggested that LGHN send a letter to Marc Ott thanking him for the opportunity to meet at the ICMA conference, and for ICMA's willingness to work on changing the culture and being more inclusive.
- There was board consensus that LGHN should be prepared in the future to go to the meeting with an agenda of what we want/expect from ICMA and be clear about the "ask."
- There was some concern that there were too many people at the meeting. Karen Davis pointed out that the meeting was published in the conference program and on the app, and LGHN members thought it was an opportunity to learn more about LGHN and ICMA.
- The board felt that a 30-minute meeting at the annual conference is not sufficient. Karen Davis said that Marc Ott made that comment after the meeting in Nashville and that we should look for a time slot that will allow for a broader discussion.
- The board asked to continue this discussion at the December meeting.
