LGHN Awards: LGHN annually presents two awards:

- *Emerging Leaders Award and Scholarship to the LGHN Conference* recognizes young professionals who demonstrate professional excellence and leadership in improving minority and disadvantaged communities through their work in their organization and their community.
- **Joel D. Valdez Legacy Award** honors Joel Valdez, long-time city manager in Tucson, Arizona, and the impetus behind the creation of LGHN. He was a role model and mentor to many young professionals in public administration and the IHN founders established this distinguished service award to honor him. A bust in the ICMA office with plaques identifies award winners.
